NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Glocester hereby requests the General Assembly to enact legislation to authorize the Town to issue general obligation bonds and/or notes in an amount not to exceed \$9,200,000 to finance the renovation and/or expansion at the Glocester Police Station, on Chopmist Hill Road, including incidental furnishings and equipment and costs of issuance, substantially in the form presented to the Town Council with such changes as the Town Solicitor or bond counsel may deem necessary or appropriate, such legislation and bond issuance to be subject to voter approval at a referendum to be held on November 5, 2024 or such earlier date as may be determined by the Town Council.

Through the Pandemic Recovery Office, the State has made federal funds available through the Municipal Community Learning Center Program. This program authorizes recipients to use funds for critical capital projects that directly enable work, education, and health monitoring. In September 2023, it was determined that the only eligible recipients for these capital funds in Glocester are the libraries. The Town is acting as the grant recipient and passing those grant funds through to the Glocester Manton and Harmony Libraries for capital improvements to their buildings.

The Town of Foster has determined that they are not able to utilize their funding and has offered to pass it to the Town of Glocester for use on the library projects in exchange for allowing Foster residents to use the facilities and participate in any programming at the libraries. This is a similar relationship to other neighboring Towns including Middletown and Newport and Hopkinton and Richmond. In order to formalize this relationship, the Town must submit the attached letter of intent and Memorandum of Agreement with the Town of Foster.

I am requesting authorization for the Town Council President to sign the attached letter of intent and MOA.

Burlingame stated that he was not hopeful that an agreement would be worked out. G. Treml asked what plan B would be. Councilor J. Burlingame stated that it was up to the school. G. Treml stated that there is work that needs to get done at the schools, especially to the boilers at both schools, so there needs to be a plan as to how it will get done.

- 2. R. LeBeouf, resident, stated a complaint about a tall fabric fence on a neighbor's yard and questioned how and why zoning would allow such a long and high fabric fence to be in place as a temporary fence. R. LeBeouf stated that the tall fabric fence is preventing him from enjoying the beauty of his property. R. LeBeouf stated a concern is that if this type of fencing is allowed under zoning then it can become out of hand everywhere in town. Councilor S. Arnold thanked R. LeBeouf for bringing this matter to Council's attention. Councilor W. Worthy stated Council will ask questions.
- 3. J. Fecteau, resident, stated that at the April 4th meeting of the School Committee the Regional School Superintendent was offered the additional position as the Glocester superintendent. J. Fecteau stated that she feels Glocester residents would not be in favor and feels they may not know. J. Fecteau stated as a Glocester resident she does not want the Region to be involved in Glocester schools. J. Fecteau stated her opinion that she feels this is a back door approach to full regionalization. J. Fecteau stated that she wanted people to be aware.
 - J. Fecteau stated that the town and the school committee has been talking about who will do the maintenance for the Glocester schools for quite a while. J. Fecteau stated her opinion that the Schools have been left in a mess under the care of the Region. J. Fecteau stated that the Fogarty School bond for repairs is almost done being paid off. J. Fecteau stated that she hopes that when the Council considers the possible plans they consider that Glocester takes care of its own schools and not leave it to the Region because it seems they only care about the money they receive.

Councilor J. Burlingame stated that the charter allows for the town to take care of the town schools if the school committee asks. Councilor S. Arnold stated it would be interesting to hear what comes from the next school committee meeting.
